PARTNERSHIPS WITH SYNOD YOUTH MINISTRIES

Partnerships will welcome both RCA and non-RCA congregations to walk with us in growing young people and youth leaders as vibrant followers of Jesus.

As your congregation considers pathways for your young people and youth leaders, Synod Youth Ministries (SYM) offers two partnership options:

1

The first option allows your church to partner at a percentage of your congregation's annual giving: .4%. (For congregations who have recently left the RCA, this is similar to what has taken place with your assessments to the regional synod.) This option allows your church to register at the earliest date, with a 15% registration discount.

Partnering with SYM at this level gives access to all events, where in the past we've had to limit events like HIS Workcamp, Power Connection Workcamp, and Middle School Retreat to RCA churches only. Partnerships also encourage the use of support services from the Office of Youth Ministry through, for example:

- Coaching volunteer youth leaders,
- Networking with paid youth ministry staff persons,
- Resourcing small and large congregations with fresh ideas and up-to-date information in the exciting and eternally important area of youth ministry.

The second option is for your church to participate through HIS Workcamp, Power Connection, Middle School Retreat and Rocky Mountain High at an increased registration cost. Non-partner registrations are at standard rates as space allows.

Where does your partnership money go?

All partnership funds stay entirely within the Synod Youth Ministry budget. No funds go toward the expenses of other Synod of the Heartland staff and no funds go to the denominational budget of the RCA. You can be confident that partnership monies stay local and remain completely within Synod Youth Ministries.

Registration monies do not cover all the expenses of our events. Our new post-high event, ReCon, will be open to everyone. Our SYM staff and dedicated volunteers plan Rocky Mountain High over three years and also plan and implement other events and gatherings. Everyday office expenses and other parts of our employees' compensation package also add up. Making life-changing events happen takes prayer, people, time and financial support. Your Partnership is needed to keep SYM ministering to youth and youth leaders all across the Upper Midwest and beyond.

1. About God

3. About The Holy Spirit

4. About The Bible

5. About Human Beings

6. About Salvation

Eternal life begins the moment one receives Jesus Christ into their life by faith.
